





He mentioned that it is predicted that we will have a good monsoon season so hopefully we won't have to water the trees again this summer. We are monitoring the trees closely and they are looking good!

RESTRICTION NOTICE

Effective May 26th, 2022, until rescinded

Fire Prevention Order No. AZ-010-22-02

Establishes Stage 2 fire restrictions for Bureau of Land Management (BLM) administered public lands within the Kingman Field Office in Arizona.

The effective date of this order is May 26th, 2022 and will remain in effect until rescinded based on fire danger rating.

The following acts are prohibited on BLM managed lands until further notice:

1. **Building maintaining, attending, or using a fire, campfire, charcoal, coal, or wood stove including fires in developed campgrounds or improved sites.**
2. **Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building.**
3. **Discharging a firearm except while engaged in a lawful hunt pursuant to state, federal, or tribal laws and regulations.**
4. **Mechanical and industrial prohibitions**
 - a. **Operating any internal combustion engine such as chainsaws or similar equipment.**
 - b. **Welding, or operating acetylene or other torch with open flame.**
 - c. **Using an explosive.**



Fire Prevention Order Number AZ910-2021-001 and AZ910-2022-001 (partial description):

Fireworks, airborne luminaries, tracers, explosives, steel core, incendiary ammunition and explosive chemical devices or binary explosives, incendiary bomb, grenade or similar device. Any combustible or explosive composition. Igniting of tires, petroleum products are prohibited year-round and apply to all BLM managed lands within Arizona.

the Meadview subdivision
determined that to maintain the
friendly small town attraction of
Meadview, a central meeting &
recreational facility was needed.

They set up the MCA with
involuntary membership to
property owners. A number of
Meadview families agreed and
the Articles of Incorporation
were created and accepted by
the State of Arizona. With an
\$80,000 loan to erect the
facility; construction of the
lounge, kitchen and pool began
January of 1971 and completed
in July that same year.
