Friends of the Joshua Tree Forest

The USGS scientists studying the moth which pollinates our eastern Joshua Trees have just finished their second season collecting data in our forest. They visited our forest each month from February to June, each visit lasting 2-3 days. Each day they spent long hours in the forest checking and collecting data on the selected study trees in various parts of the forest. If you saw two women on foot hauling around ladders and buckets of equipment while recording data, you saw "The Mothryns" as we affectionately call them! They will now be spending many hours in their lab in Tucson analyzing the data collected. We are looking forward to hearing their conclusions and updates. We are hopeful that their funding will be extended for another season since there is much more to learn about the life cycle of our beautiful Joshua Trees. The Pew Charitable Trust has recently highlighted our Joshua Tree Forest on a platform called BLMwild. You can view the posts on Facebook, Instagram and Twitter by searching for the BLMwild posts and looking for the picture of a couple of magnificent Joshua Trees. We are honored to be included in their focus on ACECs (Areas of Critical Environmental Concern) such as our unique forest.



Meadview Civic Association Inc. The purpose of our organization is to foster & encourage the civic advancement of our members and/or property owners. However, Social Membership applications are also cogitated. In August of 1970, the owners of the Meadview subdivision determined that to maintain the friendly small town attraction of Meadview, a central meeting & recreational facility was needed. They set up the MCA with involuntary membership to property owners. A number of Meadview families agreed and the Articles of Incorporation were created and accepted by the State of Arizona. With an \$80,000 loan to erect the facility; construction of the lounge, kitchen and pool began January of 1971 and completed in July that same year.
