### Special Notice to ALL MCA Members Legal Notice of Election

#### I. Candidate Eligibility:

A slate of candidates, all of whom are members in good standing of the Meadview Civic Association, shall be selected by a nominating committee. The consent of all candidates shall be obtained before placing their names on the ballot. At the annual meeting a member present may nominate a member for the Board of Governors. No write-in candidates shall be accepted unless nominated at the annual meeting. No member nominated at the annual meeting shall be considered unless the candidate consents to serve if elected. The presiding officer shall limit nominating speeches from the to one (1) minute each.

#### II. Who May Vote:

Only members in good standing will be eligible to vote. To be a member in good standing that all association assessments on lots being voted, have been paid in full by **2 P.M., THE FRIDAY PRIOR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING.**

#### III. Voting Eligibility:

A person eligible to vote in this election must be the owner or co-owner of Meadview property which is presently being assessed by the Association.

One vote only may be cast for each lot so assessed. Where a lot or lots are owned by one or more persons, only one of the persons names as co-owner may vote for any one lot. Only one vote per lot is allowed.

You may vote by absentee ballot if unable to attend the meeting. You must request your absentee ballot from the Secretary of the Board. Carefully follow the instructions sent with your ballot(s) and return to the Secretary. **ABSENTEE BALLOTS MUST BE BY THE SECRETARY OF THE ASSOCIATION RECEIVED BY THE CLOSE OF THE LAST BUSINESS DAY PRIOR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING.**

#### IV. Verification of Voting Eligibility:

Each prospective voter will be required to present proper identification prior to receiving the ballot(s) for voting. Association records will be checked to verify that such person is a member in good standing. Each prospective voter will then be given the specific number of ballots, one for each member lot, and will then cast his/her ballot(s) immediately after verification.

Voting hours shall be from the conclusion of the annual meeting to 2:00 p.m.

There shall be no electioneering within one hundred (100) yards of the polling place.

**V. Ballots for Voting:** Subsequent to verification of eligibility to vote, members will be given one (1) ballot for each lot for which he/she is authorized to cast a vote. Members, after verification of eligibility to vote, and receiving the ballot(s) shall proceed to vote and deposit said ballot(s) in the ballot box within ten (10) minutes. A member voting for more than ten (10) ballots shall have multiples of ten (10) minutes for each ten (10) ballots being voted.

#### VI. Voting Procedures:

**A.** In accordance with the desires of the majority of the Association members as expressed at the May 28, 1988 meeting and at the prerogative of the present Board

of Governors as authorized in Article III, Section I of the By-Laws of the Association, the number of persons to sit on the Board of Governors shall be seven (7).

**B.** Place an "X" in the box beside the name of each candidate you wish to vote for. On all propositions, place an "X" in the appropriate box. On all proposed By-Laws changes mark an "X" in the appropriate box. **C.** Fold your ballot and deposit in the ballot box provided.

**NOTE:** Voting for more candidates than seats available will invalidate the ballot.

#### VII. Ballot Counting:

**A.** After all the ballots have been cast, the Election Committee will open the ballot box and proceed to count and record the votes.

**B.** To verify proper performance in all aspects of the election, the election will be monitored by appointed Association members.

#### VIII. Installation of Officers:

**A.** Immediately after the determination of names of the winning candidates, the newly elected members will assume their positions on the Board.

**B.** In accordance with Article III of the Association By-Laws, the Board members will be elect executive officers from their own ranks. The executive officers of the Association shall be President, Vice-President, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer. **C.**

This Board of Governors shall manage and control the business affairs of the Association in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Articles of Incorporation and the By-Laws of the Association.

#### IX. Voting by Absentee Ballot:

Members can request an absentee ballot, one for each lot on which an assessment is paid, which will list the slate of candidate dates, Propositions, and the proposed By-Law changes. The request form for absentee ballots should be filled in and mailed to:

Upon receipt of the request form, eligibility and number of votes entitled to be cast will be determined. The ballot(s) will be mailed to the requester with a return envelope addressed to the Secretary of the Board. After indicating your choice of candidates and By-Law changes, seal the ballot(s) in the envelope addressed to the Secretary. Walk-in Absentee ballots will be accepted until, **2 P.M., THE FRIDAY PRIOR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING.** Absentee Ballots received after **THE FRIDAY PRIOR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING** mail pick-up, will be invalid.

Upon receipt the sealed envelope with the absentee ballot showing the Bar Code of the voter shall be logged in and placed in a locked ballot box. On election Day, the Election Committee will remove the ballot from the envelope for counting purposes.





**REVIEW OF COM MEETINGS**  
**MARCH/APRIL**

The speaker for the February meeting was Alice Newton, Vegetation Manager for the National Park Service. She spoke on how to gather seeds from out desert plants and using them to beautify the bare spots along Sandy Point. She will set up workshops to teach the correct gathering and saving seeds and then in the Fall she will be here to plant the seeds. She asked for those interested in attending the workshop to sign up with her. There were quite a large number of bald eagles, young and old, counted on the entire length of Lake Mead during the nationwide BackYard Bird Count. Friends of the Arizona Joshua Tree Forest also counted birds at the Grand Canyon Western Ranch and along the Grand Wash Cliffs.

The speaker for the March meeting was Meadview's own Liz Buckingham who had a very comprehensive program on the benefits available for veterans and their spouses. This included not only health care, but pension, compensation, and burial. She will be asked to return for another presentation. She is available to help all veterans and their spouses and her service is free. Liz, a former service officer and veteran, has been an advocate for veterans benefits for over 15 years. This was a very informative program. We also introduced two of the men who will be running for Sheriff of Mohave County in the Primary election in August. The slate for the LMRFD Fire Board was announced and those seven will be introduced to the community at the LMRFD meeting in Dolan on March 21, and in Meadview on April 18.

The April 7 COM speaker will be Amanda Kaufman from Search and Rescue. She will explain what the group does, how and why. Buffalo Hayden will accompany her. This should be a very informative meeting. Remember, cookies and coffee are available at 9:45 with the meeting starting at 10. All are welcomed to attend.



**Friends of the** Arizona Joshua Tree Forest have some very exciting news to share. We have partnered with an international team of scientists on an initiative to sequence the genome of the Joshua Tree (*Yucca brevifolia* in the broad sense). The project aims to identify genes involved in co-evolution with yucca moths and climate adaptation.

The project includes a social media campaign to generate public engagement, and promote public understanding of conservation genomics. ### **Why Sequence The Joshua Tree Genome?**

A Joshua tree reference genome would open the doors to answering many questions, of both scientific and conservation importance.

**Discovering genes that allow adaptation to desert environments.** The Mojave Desert contains some of the hottest and most arid regions of North America. To survive in these inhospitable environments, Joshua trees have developed an array of physiological and morphological adaptations, from thickening of the waxy cuticle on the outside the leaves, to reduced stomatal pore size, and the presence of water storage cells. Sequencing the Joshua tree genome will help to identify the genetic basis of these adaptations, and will identify existing genetic variation in Joshua trees that may allow some individuals to survive and adapt to warmer temperatures. We will combine genome-wide-association studies with gene expression assays in common gardens to determine which genes have enabled Joshua trees to survive in the Mojave.

**Understanding the genetics of co-evolution.** Like all yuccas, Joshua trees rely on a specialized group of moths to move their pollen from plant to plant. Amazingly, female moths actively collect and distribute yucca pollen after laying their eggs in the flowers they pollinate. Yucca moths effectively farm yucca seeds as nutrition for their offspring. In exchange for reliable pollination, yuccas sacrifice some of their seeds to the moths' larvae. Joshua tree flowers exhibit a suit of adaptations that promote active moth pollination while deterring larval consumption of all their developing seeds. The genetic bases of these adaptations, however, are currently unknown. Sequencing of a reference Joshua tree genome would pave the way for association mapping to identify genes contributing to co-evolved adaptations to yucca moth pollination and larval seed predation.

**A genomic approach to conservation.** Ensuring that Joshua trees will persist into the future means preserving not only the plants themselves, but also the genetic variation that will allow them to adapt to changing climates and environments. We will use a landscape genomics approach to measure the total amount of genetic variation in different populations, and estimate genetic differentiation between populations. This information will allow us to identify which populations of Joshua tree have the greatest potential to adapt to future environmental changes, and give these areas the highest priority for conservation.

## EXPLORERS

The boat ride across to Scanlon Bay and the hike up to Joker and Jumbo mines was taken in the last days of February. Great weather and the group found the mines in the same shape as they have been in for the last 25 years. Still interesting. We also had ten burros come down and roll in the dust and wander around close to us. Seven hikers came down Marble Canyon to share a potluck lunch with the rest of us. That hike is close to 4 miles long with one horrendous limestone (marble) cliff you must get down before you get into Hualapai Wash.

The trip to Petroglyph Wash has some really interesting cliffs, canyons and mines. The Pope Mine #1 is on a high point above Kingman Wash and you can see the Vegas Strip. Coming around the Loop road we watched as a dozen Desert Big Horn Sheep swooped up to the top of the bluff. We drove around to the other side and there they were, plastered on the rocks. Five with full curls, five with half curls and two young rams with short curls standing together on one rock. The larger sheep lined themselves on the peaks of the topmost rocks making a perfect photo. We planned to drive Buck~N~Doe the 47 dirt miles to Peach Springs, but there had been a rock slide on that road, so we drove Antares to reach Peach Springs. Nothing was going to stop us from having Hualapai Tacos for lunch! We have a trip planned to drive to the Golden Mile Mining town. This town during the '70s, '80s and early '90s had several complete buildings and you could see the mine workings, but in the mid-'90s the NPS tore down the buildings and blocked the mines. It is still interesting to imagine what the town looked like.

In April we plan a drive on Alamo Lake Road to Chicken Springs Road and down 93 to the Seventeen Mile Loop. Probably come back to Wikiup to have lunch. Come join us at our regular monthly meetings where we plan hikes and trips. We meet at 6:30 in the MCA auditorium the 2nd Wednesday of each month.
