The Friends of Arizona Joshua Tree Forest are applying for certification as a Dark Sky Park for our beautiful Joshua Tree Forest Area of Critical Environmental Concern (ACEC). This area is 44,000 acres of the densest part of the forest south of Lake Mead City and east of Pierce Ferry Rd. The certification comes from the International Dark Sky Association (also known as Dark Sky) based in Tucson. This organization is a large nonprofit and has certified many dark sky places such as the Grand Canyon and Flagstaff. They have strict requirements for certification and the application process takes about two years.

A Dark Sky Park is defined as a land possessing an exceptional quality of starry nights and nocturnal environment. Also required is the area needs to be protected for its scientific, natural, educational and cultural heritage resources. Our Joshua Tree Forest certainly meets all those requirements. We have many residents who have moved here to enjoy our magnificent night sky views.

If we are awarded this certification, the benefits for our community are: broadening our base of support for protecting the area, adding another much needed layer of protection, protecting the dark sky for our wildlife, creating opportunities to enjoy the night sky while preserving the natural environment and bringing tourists to Meadview. You can support our efforts by attending our events which will be advertised on Face-book and Instagram. Also, you can look at the **Mohave County Lighting Ordinance** and consider outdoor motion sensor lights as well as being a good neighbor by checking to see that your lights are not shining in another's windows. Lastly, we need evidence of community support in the form of signed support letters. The Outpost has copies you can sign or you can email us for more information.





## **DID YOU KNOW?** It is stated in ALL Recorded Deed Restrictions for ALL Properties in ALL Units of the Community of Meadview (including non-MCA lots) that grading and clearing shall in ALL cases be held to a **minimum**.

Completely leveling and decimating our native plants is against the CCR's and if you do so, you could be sent a letter of non-compliance and fined for not complying with the CCR's.



#### **Obtaining a Burn Permit:**

Please visit our office at 16126
Pierce Ferry Rd, Dolan Springs AZ
86441 to apply for a free burn
permit. Your property may be subject
to an inspection from our fire
suppression staff before the permit
becomes valid. If it is supplied by city
water then this inspection may be
waived.

#### **Rules for Burning:**

- Must have street address posted in a visible location
- Wind speed must be less than 10 mph
- ♦ Must have water under pressure
- ♦ Only burn sunrise to sunset
- Burning must occur more than 50 feet from any structure unless the fire is contained in an approved waste burner. Then the distance is 15 feet.
- Call us at 928-767-3300 before and after you burn.
- Things that cannot be burned under any circumstances:

All Plastic Materials, Waste Petroleum Products, Hazardous Materials, Tar Paper, Poison Oak, Ivy or Sumac, Oleander, Asbestos, Aerosol Spray Cans, Flammable Liquids, Explosives or Ammunition, Polyester, Thermal Insulation, Tires, Electric Wire Insulation, Batteries, Asphalt Shingles

If you have any questions about weather or not the material you wish to burn is permitted, please give us a call at 928-767-3300.
