

Obtaining a Burn Permit:

Please visit our office at 16126
Pierce Ferry Rd, Dolan Springs AZ
86441 to apply for a free burn
permit. Your property may be subject
to an inspection from our fire
suppression staff before the permit
becomes valid. If it is supplied by city
water then this inspection may be
waived.

Rules for Burning:

- Must have street address posted in a visible location
- ♦ Wind speed must be less than 10 mph
- ♦ Must have water under pressure
- ♦ Only burn sunrise to sunset
- Burning must occur more than 50 feet from any structure unless the fire is contained in an approved waste burner. Then the distance is 15 feet.
- Call us at 928-767-3300 before and after you burn.
- Things that cannot be burned under any circumstances:

All Plastic Materials, Waste Petroleum Products, Hazardous Materials, Tar Paper, Poison Oak, Ivy or Sumac, Oleander, Asbestos, Aerosol Spray Cans, Flammable Liquids, Explosives or Ammunition, Polyester, Thermal Insulation, Tires, Electric Wire Insulation, Batteries, Asphalt Shingles





In August of 1970, the owners of the Meadview subdivision determined that to maintain the friendly small town attraction of Meadview, a central meeting & recreational facility was needed. They set up the MCA with involuntary membership to property owners. A number of Meadview families agreed and the Articles of Incorporation were created and accepted by the State of Arizona. With an \$80,000 loan to erect the facility; construction of the lounge, kitchen and pool began January of 1971 and completed in July that same year.



HISTORY OF MEADVIEW

Meadview — a name chosen for the proposed community that was the dream of Frank Glindmeier and Paul Mullane. Dolan Springs was mostly a wide spot in the road as they turned off 93 and headed north. It was late in the summer of 1960 and they knew that 48 miles north they would come to Pearce's Ferry, but they were looking for the four sections they had purchased from a rancher in May of that year. They had been told the land overlooked Lake Mead.

They found a fallen weatherbeaten wooden sign that directed them toward the lake overlook for a 'Mead View'. When Frank straightened the sign they both agreed that this would be the name of their development - Meadview.

Part of their land was inside the Lake Mead National Recreation Area (which would lead to a few problems in later years) and upon returning to town they were told that tho they had purchased 4 sections and paid \$65 an acre (2560 acres x \$65) they really didn't own the land—Dale Smith, the rancher, still had the surface rights for range use!

Glindmeier and Mullane eventually purchased those range rights and Smith even let the men fill their water barrels at his well so they could provide water to the few dedicated fishermen who drove Pearce Ferry Road. And you had to be a dedicated fishermen to drive that road. It was crooked and rough. It was a one lane washboard that jarred teeth, bounced out batteries and broke tie rods.

Then in 1964 Colorado River water was held back to fill the new Glen Canyon Dam and even those dedicated fishermen stopped coming up the road. They could not wade the expance of mud to get to the water to fish and no boat could be launched. For three years the owners pleaded with the National Park Service to get a road down to Sandy Point with a paved boat ramp at South Cove. During that time RivCor (the name chosen by Glindmeier and Mullane for their development company) started to put in paved roads and water mains for Meadview Terrace. The first well was drilled in 1966 shortly before the road and boat ramp at South Cove was finished.

Meadview now was the fist subdivision on Lake Mead to boast paved roads, water mains, and electricity (free! supplied by the 2 company generators until 1968). Electricity and telephone lines finally arrived in Meadview in 1971.

HISTORY OF MEADVIEW

MEADVIEW SUBDIVISION LAND TAKEN BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

The issue began in the mid-'60's when the Lake Mead Recreation Area director. Charles Ritchey (who had been a National Park Director and who now found it difficult to lower his expectations for compliance to demands made upon private landowners) set a policy that stated that no development should be visible from the lake surface. He then decided that any private land that rimmed the overlook of the lake would have to be placed in to recreation area land. In return the federal government would offer those property owners interior land.

Letters were sent to all property owners, including the subdividers, with a bottom line stating that if the land was not sold outright, it would be condemned and taken. Elmer Duffield and a Mr. Williams decided to fight. Williams eventually sold. Elmer signed an agreement that he would have lifetime estate rights, and at his death the land and all improvements would become government property.

Glindmeier stated, and Duane agreed, that the monetary offers for the land and/or buildings were generous—at least 4 and 5 times more than what had been originally paid for the land. The appraisals were done by a firm either out of Vegas or California.

(Comment was made that apparently the appraisers had no idea of what land was selling for at that time since one piece of property sold for \$14,000 and had originally cost \$4000---tho by that time the owner had received an offer of \$18,000 for that piece.)

Land that was involved included the original Unit 1, Unit 2, Estates, and part of Unit 5. All land bordering Pearce Ferry was taken also, since the plan was to put in a 'scenic drive' down to Pearce Ferry Landing. The 'scenic drive' has never been done, and probably won't be.

Buildings that had to be removed, or torn down included the sales office of the original developer, several mobile homes, a store and gas station, an A frame house and 2 or 3 homes built of rock. One home was moved to what is now Meadview Blvd. just east of the turnoff from Pearce Ferry.

Land that was enchanged is anything east of Sandy Point which now is known as City Center, Foot Hills, Valley 1 and 2, Terrace, Highlands, the Knolls and Unit 8.

. Negotions dragged on for years and Duane received what was probably the last escrow dated in July of 1976.

Frank Glindmeier and Duane Johnson have stated that they were never treated badly by the government, nor did they or anyone else lose money, but they both can get a bit hostile when they recall what they consider the high-handed attitude of Ritchey when the issue was first proposed.
